As you know, we solicit your input each year on our anonymous survey. The May 2011 survey was extremely positive and we thank everyone for your thoughtful input. Students and parents were overwhelmingly content with our curriculum delivery, positive school culture, encouraging and knowledgeable staff, Running Club, PTO activities and the general feeling of 'community' at Carrillo. Part of the School Site Council's job is to read every survey and create plans to address concerns voiced by Carrillo adults and children. There were 6 categories which received more than one comment so please read below for clarifications and explanations.

Communication

Many of you have asked for better communication on what is happening at the school. We have increased our means of communication through various venues. Here are some ways in which you can receive information:

- **E-blast-** Sent from our PTO summarizing school events, fundraising, calendars and other important information. Each update includes direct links so you can just click on it to receive further information. If you wish to receive weekly emails and have not "opted-in," you will find instructions on how to do so on the school website.
- **PTO liaison-** Most classrooms have a volunteer PTO liaison who pass along upcoming events, calendars and classroom activities.
- **Phone calls-** Our principle gives updates via evening phone calls and emails. All messages are posted on the website if you happen to miss it.
- **Website-** Check out www.carrilloelementary.org for full details of school events. Included on the website are printable forms and Dependables.
- **Dependables-** This is the important information that in the past has been sent home throughout the year on bright colored paper. It required your signature and needed to be returned in order for your child to go to the end of year pool party. Now, to make it easier, they are lumped together and put on the website for an electronic signature and can easily be sent back to school at a press of a button.

We realize how busy everybody is in today's world and try to offer the most convenient ways to get our families key information. We thank you for doing your part in opening emails, checking websites and listening to phone calls.

Flag Salutes

While some people felt more awards should be given, others felt we should cut back on student recognitions. The majority of students and parents suggest we continue to recognize student accomplishments however we shorten FLAG salutes by:

- putting certificates, etc. in teacher mailboxes
- calling the names of children who will simply stand in place, be recognized and then sit down.
- concentrate more on 'rallying' presentations at FLAG i.e. 7 Habits, Reading Incentive, songs or poems by grade levels, etc.
- having Birthday Books announced one time per trimester.
- Running Club awards have been adjusted and will be adjusted again next year.

Social Skills

A few students reported having been bullied while at school. Some of these students felt that the issue had not been resolved. The administration and staff at Carrillo feel that this issue is of utmost importance. No child should have to come to school and feel unwelcome or unsafe. We have come up with some specific steps to take when bullying occurs and will be discussing it with the students. We hope you will reiterate these positive steps at home with your children.

- 1) Tell the other person in very clear language what they are doing, how it makes you feel and tell them to stop.
- 2) Encourage children to stand up for themselves and expect respect from others.
- 3) If bullying behaviors do not stop, walk away from the situation, choose another activity and/or report the situation.
- 4) If troubles continue, report situations to a supervisor, teacher or administrator immediately. Often times bullying is not reported and therefore impossible to address. It is also important to have some information about the bully (name, description, class they are in).
- 5) If you feel that the situation has not been taken care of, re-address concerns with an adult to resolve the situation.
- 6) Our Peace Patrol program has been revamped and is under the skilled guidance of Mrs. Foster and Mrs. Carlstrom. Peace Patrol trains numerous upper grade students in conflict resolution. These students are visible on campus during lunch and recess periods each day, to offer help, in any and all situations which may arise.
- 7) As you know we have also instituted the 7 Habits of Happy Kids program to strengthen our Responsibility Skills and Steps to Respect programs. Explicitly teaching children social skills is the cornerstone of this program which gives children tools to use in a variety of social situations.

While it is important to let your child learn how to handle a variety of situations that they may encounter as they move through the grades, they should feel that they can rely on the adults at the school when a situation is beyond their control. The Carrillo staff is fully committed to making every child feel welcome and safe!

Parking Lot

Providing a safe, effective way for our students to arrive and leave school is always of utmost importance. City and district engineers continually review and analyze our lot from every angle imaginable. They've looked at relocating car lanes, adding a third lane to enter and exit, organizing the kids for pick up in a new way. You name it, they looked at it. Based on the size, location, volume of traffic and the overarching need for safety...the result is what you see today.

What does this mean for us as parents? First, know that what can be done is being done. Patience, mutual respect and having ALL parents follow the parking lot rules, combined with the structure of our parking lot, will ensure a more positive flow for everyone. It is a great opportunity for us to model some of our 7 Habits to the children i.e. synergize and first things first. When it's raining outside, the bell is ringing and you are in the left turn lane on Poinsettia for longer than usual...remember that a child's life and safety come before any appointment or level of impatience you might have.

The Leo Carrillo Ranch allows us to use their parking lot for pick up out of kindness, not obligation! Thank you. Thank you, too, for all of the families that walk and carpool to and from school.

Cafeteria

Vast improvements have been made and are continuing to be made each month by Child Nutrition Services (CNS). Fresh fruit and vegetables are offered every day and the menu variety has increased markedly. Whole grains are now used in bread/buns and items are baked rather than fried. As part of the 3 daily choices there is also a vegetarian option.

Many Student Council members from Carrillo have participated in focus groups to offer suggestions regarding taste and packaging of newly introduced items. Check out this department on the district website for further information concerning improvements in our hot lunch program. If you choose to have your child purchase lunch you're in good hands but naturally you always have the option of packing a lunch from home should that be your preference.

Kids on Campus (KOC)

KOC as you know is located on our campus and offers before and after school care for children. This program is directed through our San Marcos Unified School District. Food For Thought

Let's Work Together to WATCH Our WORDS

Well-meaning parents often make a very common mistake. Being pretty or smart is something your child has no control over. If you are telling them they are pretty or smart all of the time, they begin to align that with who they are and not what they can do.

How much more beneficial to say things like; "You are such a hard worker. You stick to a problem until it is solved." "Your eyes sparkle because you take such good care of your health." "You have such a happy attitude, you light up a room." These statements refer to something they can control and encourage positive behaviors.

All parents want their children to feel good about themselves. The best self-esteem comes from when they value their own efforts, set individual goals or overcome something that was personally challenging. Help them focus on their efforts by saying things like, "You were sad, but you just turned it around and made it a better day....wow you have a great attitude." "You could have been sad about your friend playing with someone else but instead you found someone else to play with....that was awesome!" "You were frustrated but you were able to calm down and think about how to handle this situation."

Another area of caution is unknowingly feeding into a child's fears or areas which may be a bit weak. For example, saying....." She is really shy," will open the opportunity for children to form a self-image of "Yes. That is who I am. I am shy." It can also possibly excuse other behaviors which should simply be corrected. Or saying, "I always struggled in math too" may be interpreted by a child may mean, don't bother it's just the way it is. This attitude doesn't allow the child to look beyond, be an individual and perhaps keep trying. It may also encourage children to internalize a self-image which may not necessarily remain constant as they mature. They may think, "That is who I am, therefore....."

Let's not forget kids pick up lots of cues from adults and what we say often determines their self-perception. Have confidence in your voice and be positive. They will hear and come to believe, "I can do this!"

For this school year-to-date, we have spent the majority of the funds on our programs which include Music, Computer Lab, PE, Library, Peace Patrol and Reading Lab. Salaries for these programs are paid on a trimester basis. The amount paid-to-date includes first and second trimester salaries, in addition to, the reimbursement to the District for the balance of these salaries. Projected expenses for the remainder of the school year are \$37,075 including the third trimester program salaries in the amount of \$9,381. Projected income for the remainder of the year is \$36,490.

With the upcoming fundraising events (including Jog-A-Thon, Ladies Spring Tea, and Strawberry sales) plus the 3rd installment of the EZ pledges to be processed on February 16th, we anticipate reaching our projected income goal. With our conservative spending, the expenses are on or under budget. Any excess funds remaining at the end of the year will replenish reserves and/or be invested into additional technology upgrades for the classrooms.

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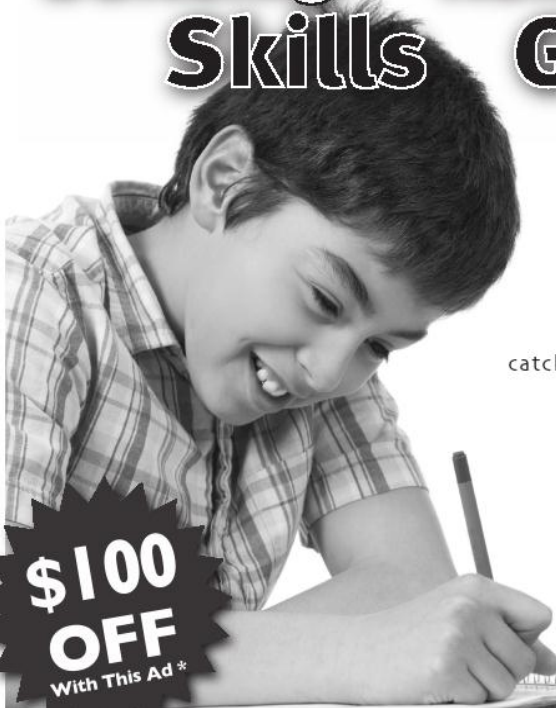
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
