## The 7 Habits of Happy Kids

At Carrillo we believe that an effective character education program needs to be ingrained in all we do... in other words, it's how we do business. Yes, we want a safe and orderly environment that provides physical as well as emotional security which is conducive to learning. But truly we want it to be so much more... we want to continue on our path to GREATNESS! We invite you to join us in our efforts to model and teach our children the skills necessary to ensure strong character development and a happy and healthy school climate.

All staff members have been working to refine The Carrillo Way Character Education program. Our motto is: 'DO THE RIGHT THING BECAUSE IT'S THE RIGHT THING TO DO, EVEN WHEN NO ONE IS LOOKING.' We've investigated numerous programs and while we'll continue to teach the Steps to Respect, our new character education backbone is based on The 7 Habits of Happy Kids by Sean Covey. Additionally, we are implementing ideas from Five Points of Value for a Fulfilling Life by Dr. Mohan Sood. Both books offer a remarkable parallel viewpoint as these positive characteristics are universal. Copies of both books are available for parent checkout in our school library or you may purchase your own copy if you desire.

Currently, staff members are engaged in an overview of the 7 Habits and beginning in November, all Carrillo students will focus on one Habit each month. Here is a short synopsis of the Habits.

**Habit 1: Be Proactive** – I am a responsible person. I take initiative. I choose my actions, attitudes, and moods. I do not blame others for my wrong actions. I do the right thing without being asked, even when no one is looking.

**Habit 2: Begin with the End in Mind** – I plan ahead and set goals. I do things that have meaning and make a difference. I am an important part of my classroom and contribute to my school's mission and vision, and look for ways to be a good citizen.

**Habit 3: Put First Things First** – I spend my time on things that are most important. This means I say no to things I know I should not do. I set priorities, make a schedule, and follow my plan. I am disciplined and organized.

**Habit 4: Think Win-Win** – I balance courage for getting what I want with consideration for what others want. I make deposits in others' Emotional Bank Accounts. When conflicts arise, I look for third alternatives.

**Habit 5: Seek First to Understand, Then to be Understood** – I listen to other people's ideas and feelings. I try to see things from their viewpoints. I listen to others without interrupting. I am confident in voicing my ideas. I look people in the eyes when talking.

## 7 Habits (con't)

**Habit 6: Synergize** – I value other people's strengths and learn from them. I get along well with others, even people who are different than me. I work well in groups. I seek out other people's ideas to solve problems because I know that by teaming with others, we can create better solutions than any one of us alone. I am humble.

**Habit 7: Sharpen the Saw** – I take care of my body by eating right, exercising, and getting sleep. I spend time with family and friends. I learn in lots of ways and lots of places, not just at school. I take time to find meaningful ways to help others.

Research has shown that particular skills are lacking as students enter college and the work force. While many students have demonstrated mastery of subject matter content as they leave high school, universities and business leaders alike are finding that students are lacking the skills to collaborate, think critically and creatively, analyze information, demonstrate effective written and oral communication, problem solve, take initiative, and adapt to new situations and environments. We believe that by teaching the 7 Habits of Happy Kids and making it the backbone of our character education program we are addressing these skills in a powerful way (and skills that will last a lifetime) as well as doing the right thing for children.

## The History and Role of Red Ribbon Week

Today, the Red Ribbon Celebration is one of the most recognized annual drug prevention awareness campaigns across the country. Do you know why we celebrate Red Ribbon Week? Here is the story behind this event.

Enrique “Kiki” Camarena grew up in Mexico until the age of nine when his family moved to the United States. He was a good student who liked sports and working on his school yearbook. In high school he was voted “best all-around senior.” Enrique went on to college and was able to achieve a degree in Criminal Justice.

After college he served as a United States Marine and then as a policeman for the Calexico and El Centro, California Police Departments. In 1974 he joined the United States Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) as a Special Agent. Enrique worked for the DEA for four years trying to stop drugs from coming into this country.

Unfortunately, on February 7, 1985 Enrique was killed by people who were threatened by his investigations and efforts toward stopping the use of illegal drugs. The tragic end to Enrique’s life made national news and his death ignited a huge response. This led to the development of the Red Ribbon Celebration, observed in October which is Crime Prevention Month.

In 1988, as a result of Enrique Camarena’s personal sacrifice, the National Federation of Parents for Drug-Free Youth coordinated the first national Red Ribbon Week, a celebration proclaimed by the Congress of the United States.

Red Ribbon week will not - nor is it intended to - single handedly resolve the drug problem. There is not a single prevention program or approach to prevention that can eliminate a problem so complex. It is not a

single prevention program or approach to prevention that can eliminate a problem so complex. It is not a curriculum, an after school program, or a parent education program.

The annual Red Ribbon Celebration is an AWARENESS CAMPAIGN. It acts as a catalyst to enhance and strengthen on-going prevention efforts in schools and communities around the nation. Red Ribbon Week advocates for research-based prevention principles and strategies that have proven effective in reducing problems associated with substance abuse. It provides an opportunity to raise the awareness of young people regarding drug abuse and chemical dependency.

As part our Safe Schools Plan, Carrillo students are proud to participate in Red Ribbon Week this year from **Oct. 24, 2011 to Oct. 28, 2011**. Ask your children about special daily events at school and initiate family discussions concerning the use of illegal drugs. Raising educated **AND** healthy children is a #1 standard at Carrillo.

## Treasurer's Report

While the California state budget crisis has resulted in deep cuts to our schools, Carrillo Elementary continues to rank among the top elementary schools in the state, and our test scores continue to rise. Our students thrive with outstanding staff and exceptional programs available here at Carrillo, many of which are funded by the PTO. To continue to provide our children this high quality of education, the Carrillo PTO has committed to raise nearly \$125,000 this year. This money will help fund computer, art, science, music and math resources. It pays for physical education, reading lab, library, spelling bee and assemblies. The PTO also funds basic expenditures such as textbooks, teacher copies and essential school supplies.

All families at Carrillo are part of the Parent Teacher Organization, and last year, YOU the PTO community raised just over \$126,000, all of which went directly back into the school. And with conservative spending last year, we were able to purchase technology upgrades for the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms. Thank you! Without your support, many of our programs would be scaled back, or even eliminated completely.

We have many fundraisers coming up this year. In addition to the entertainment books, upcoming are the gift wrap fundraiser in the fall, the Jog-a-Thon in the spring, as well as, the Ladies Tea at the end of the year. There are so many ways you can support Carrillo, you can purchase books from the book fairs, go to a Dine-Out, bid on a parking space, participate in passive fundraising such as Box Tops, eScrip, Target, Shell and more – just check out the PTO section on the school website and/or the Virtual Thursday Envelopes for additional information.

We need your help to continue to provide the quality programs that are such an integral part of life at Carrillo. While \$125,000 is a significant amount, it equates to only \$127.00 per child per year or \$0.70 per child per day. Let's work together to make this happen for our children, they deserve it. And Remember, 100% of the money donated to Carrillo Parent Teacher Organization is tax deductible!

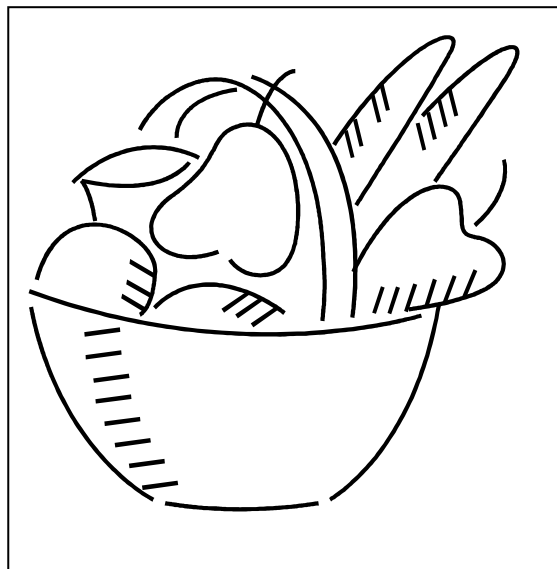
## Holiday Food Drive

### How does running club work?

- Every lap around the track is  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile. 4 times around is 1 mile.
- They don't necessarily have to "run", they just have to complete a lap. So they can walk, skip, hop, twirl, or crawl. Any way they want to get in a lap.
- Each time a student has completed 20 laps (5 miles) they earn a running shoe charm for their shoelace/necklace.
- When the student has completed a full card (25 miles) they get recognized at the following Friday flag salute.
- When they reach 100 miles they earn a t-shirt and an opportunity to run off campus with an adult (with parent permission). We have medals for 200 and 300 miles; trophies for 400 & 500 miles; a plaque and a special running shirt when they reach 600 miles and beyond!

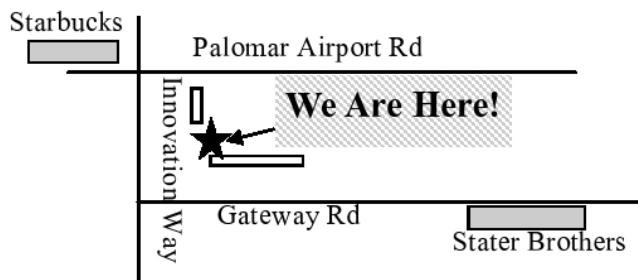

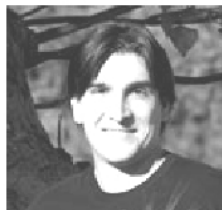

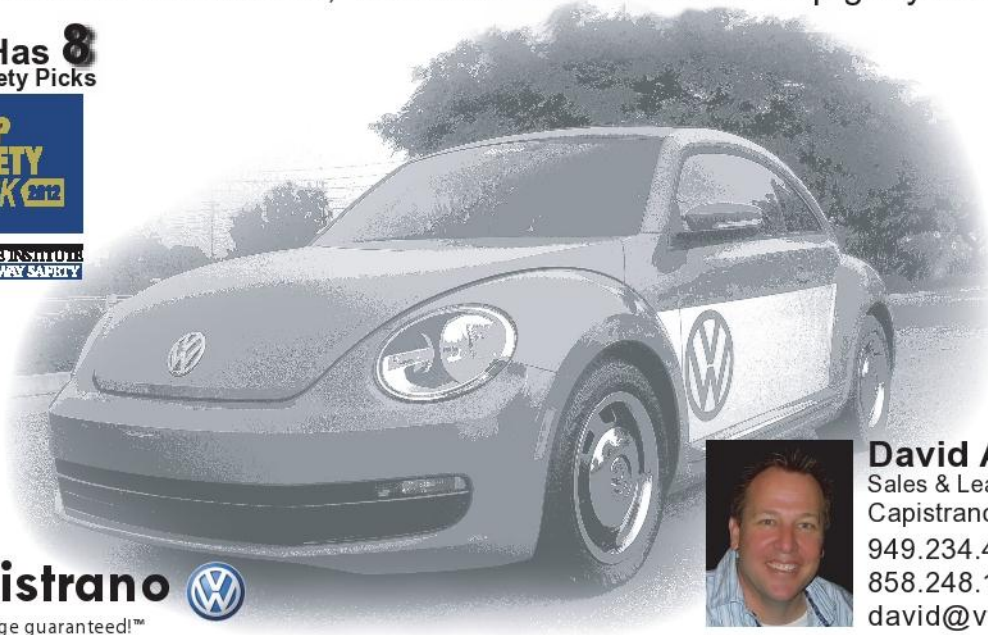
